



Outcome of the Programme:


Teaching at an Elementary School

For extension activity, second year students were grouped into teams and rendered their social activity in the nearby villages. Awareness on usage of plastic was given to the public Sevalpatti, sokkanathapuram, seravayal, vairavanpatti, sembanur, thirumayam-rangiyam, seravayal puthur and thaanipatti on 4.11.2022 and 5.11.2022. Usage of plastic and plastic pollution is nowadays a serious threat to biodiversity. Plastic usage brings several harmful effects to the human beings. Students interacted with the public people and enumerated the harmful effects. They also suggested to use alternative methods such as cloth bags for everyday use. They insisted to carry cloth bags whenever they go to purchase anything. Another group of students gave awareness on basic computer knowledge to the school students on 07.11.2022 at Vairavanpatti and seravayal. They taught about basic operations such as notepad usage and paint tools. Students also practiced the basic steps in laptops.

Outcome of the programme:

The extension activities conducted by second-year students in nearby villages had a significant impact on both the local communities and the students themselves. They gained knowledge about the harmful effects of plastic and were encouraged to adopt eco-friendly practices such as using cloth bags.





Outcome of the programme:



In conformity with one of the goals of our college to serve the society and as a part of CBCS Curriculam (Part V) Extension activity is carried out by the Department of Business Administration regularly.

In this academic year 2022-2023, Department of Business Administration undertook extension activity in the month of October 2022. The II BBA students of Arumugam Pillai Seethai Ammal College, Tirupathur are finding solace in planting saplings of trees and created Awareness about uses and benefits of planting saplings in the schools nearby their hometown, Visit to Old age Home, , Road Safety, Visit to old age home, Awareness Against Plastic **to** 100 Day Scheme Workers, **and** Plantation of plamyra. The students of II BBA were grouped into a team and attended the extension activities Totally 52 students have participated in various extension activities on 21.10.2022, 26.10.2022, and 29.10.2022.

This programme was carried out in the Government and Private School, Old age home, Temple and kandavarayanpatti, Tirupathur union as a part of the various efforts to inculcate the habit of cleanliness in the place where the education is provided,. The main objective of this awareness program is to give awareness abour the uses and benefits of tree plantation and our students motivated the school student to plant at least one sapling on their birthday. Apart from that, our students have recommend planting and gifting saplings on any important events. They have created awareness among the school students about the benefits and uses of tree planting. They have created awareness about planting saplings that provide oxygen during the day. Planting in the middle of the two-lane road helps to prevent distraction of driver view from the glare of oncoming vehicles at night and prevents vehicle fumes from spreading into the air. Apart from creating awareness, they have also planted saplings at specific places in the school premises and they have nominated some students along with the school headmaster to take care of the saplings they have planted. Our Students have Engaged Activities for Elderly People at Old Age Homes which is located near kandavarayanpatti. Totally there were 50 old age people generally aged between 50 to 90 years. The Purpose behind visiting was to help senior citizen in all possible ways. They helped every senior citizen in doing their daily work. They have served food and helped them to do their day to day activity. They also cleaned

the Old age Home. The visit to the old age home was a rewarding and heart-warming experience for our students. An Awareness Programme on Road Safety was carried out in Karpaga Vinayaga Primary School, Pillyarpatti and the Students were given awareness about traffic rules, the skill and knowledge to cross the road and traffic signals and Road Safety. Awareness against usage of plastics were given among the workers working in 100-Day Scheme. They were also suggested to use alternatives like cloth bags and paper bags instead of plastic bags and to avoid drinking bottled water which contributes largely to plastic pollution. Palmyra Plantation work was carried out in Ranasingapuram near Tiruppathur. It, requires less water for growth and survival and it produce oil, lumber, woven materials, multiple food sources, drinks, insulation, and so much more. Students also visited old age home and helped senior citizen in all possible ways and served lunch to them. 




Image 4: Visited Britto School in Kallal and awareness was given to students about tree plantation





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Extension Activity





Within a minute, the team contacts the user, while simultaneously sending the location as an SMS alert to registered emergency contacts. Through hands-on demonstrations and practical guidance, students were equipped with the necessary skills to navigate the app confidently in times of need. The participation of students from the History department was instrumental in effectively delivering the awareness programs. With a keen social perspective and voluntary involvement, these students ensured that the information reached the participants in a clear and accessible manner. It is estimated that more than 60 individuals, including schoolchildren and villagers, benefited from the program, gaining valuable insights into personal safety measures and the use of technology for emergency assistance. By organizing this awareness program, the Department of History demonstrated its commitment to community engagement and empowerment, particularly in promoting the safety and well-being of women. 

From October 31st to November 7th, 2022, the second-year mathematics students of APSA College, Tirupattur, took a proactive step in their own community by demonstrating the functionality and importance of the Kavalan-SOS mobile app. Through engaging demonstrations and informative sessions, they highlighted the significance of this app, particularly for the residents of Tamil Nadu, especially women and the elderly, who may find themselves in vulnerable or threatening situations. The students emphasized that with the Kavalan-SOS mobile app, individuals can swiftly access police assistance wherever they may be, ensuring a rapid response to emergencies. During the demonstrations, attendees were educated about the app's features, particularly its utility during natural calamities. It was elucidated that in times of crisis, the app serves as a crucial lifeline, allowing users to promptly contact the police for aid. One of the standout features explained was the SOS button prominently displayed on the home page of the app. It was demonstrated that in an emergency scenario, pressing this button triggers a countdown of 5 seconds. Upon completion of the countdown, the app automatically dispatches the user's current location, accompanied by video footage from the rear camera to the security team. The attendees were reassured that this swift action ensures that help is on its way within minutes. Additionally, as a safety measure, the app simultaneously sends an SMS alert containing the user's location to their registered emergency contacts, ensuring that loved ones are informed of the situation. The students' thorough explanations and hands-on demonstrations equipped the public with the knowledge and confidence to effectively utilize the Kavalan-SOS app in times of need. Through their efforts, these students not only promoted the adoption of technology for personal safety but also instilled a sense of empowerment within the community. By spreading awareness and providing practical guidance, they contributed to creating a safer environment for all residents of Tamil Nadu. This demonstration serves as a testament to the proactive role that young individuals can play in fostering community resilience and security.

Outcome of the Program

The program yielded significant outcomes for various stakeholders involved. Through the proactive efforts of the second-year mathematics students of APSA College, Tirupattur, and their engaging demonstrations, attendees, including residents of Tamil Nadu, women, and the elderly, were empowered with essential knowledge about the Kavalan-SOS mobile app. This heightened awareness and understanding of the app's features and utility served to empower individuals to utilize technology effectively for their safety. Stakeholders such as law enforcement agencies also benefited from increased

public engagement with the app, potentially leading to quicker response times during emergencies. Completing applications for ration cards, scholarships, disability certificates, and social security benefits. Facilitating bank account openings.


Demystifying bureaucratic language and procedures.





EXTENSION ACTIVITIES REPORT - Academic year 22 – 23.


Activity 1 Temple cleaning:



As these students continue to spread awareness and knowledge, they pave the way for a safer and more secure future for all citizens of Tamil Nadu.

The students' engagement with the Kaavalan app raised awareness about its functionality and utility for accessing police assistance swiftly. By educating participants on how to use the app during emergencies, they empowered individuals to take proactive measures for their safety. 
Activity 4

People be in Tamil Nadu, especially, Women and elderly people can use the Kavalan whenever they feel helpless or vulnerable. People can reach the spot at the earliest possible threat when the app is used. Moreover, at times of natural disaster with the help of this app the public can seek the help of the police. They were also educated to give a clear view about the App download so that they may explain it in their campaign. Students were asked to brief the village people about "how to use the app". Our staff members explained the process of operating the app. During an emergency, please press the SOS button on the home page. It will start a 5 second count down. After 5 seconds, the app will automatically send your current location along with a video from your back camera to the Kavalan team. Within a minute, the team will contact you. Simultaneously, your location will also be sent to your registered emergency contacts as an SMS alert The Kaavalan App awareness programme was initiated with the help of the students to create an awareness among the village girl students to protect themselves during emergency.


Outcome of the Programme





































WETLAND BIRD CENSUS



EXTENSION ACTIVITIES 2022- 2023

The second B.Sc. Chemistry students and the faculties along with the lab assistants participated in extension activities on 16.10.2022 at four different remote villages namely, Koratti, Thattati, Kundrakudi and Thulavoor. The second-year students (42) and third year students who didn't attend the activity in the previous year were divided in to four groups so that a group and one of the faculties will be responsible for these activities in each village. Each group taking these activities are divided into three subgroups so that each subgroup take responsibility for an activity in that village. Thus, we carried out three activities at four different villages simultaneously.


ACTIVITY – 1, KAVALAN SOS (SAVE OUR SHIP)

The Kavalan SOS free apps were introduced by Tamil Nadu government for intimating the police department when a person is in danger or needs immediate assistance. The app was introduced on 30.10.2018. Our students explained the importance of the apps among the village people especially ladies by referring an incident at Chennai. In that incident two strangers entered into the house in which two ladies were alone by saying that they are from courier firm. One of them pressed the emergency red button and alerted the nearby police station and averted the unexpected and unwanted events that might have happened. They explained that people can use the app under the following conditions to seek the police assistance instantly in emergency situations such as, Physical emergencies, Eve teasing, Kidnapping and During the natural disasters such as Floods, Earthquake, Fire, etc. Students also explained that the app will not lead to any unwanted situation by explaining what the processes are taking place when a person press the red button. On pressing of emergency red button, User live location will be shared with control room, user details will be identified, and nearest Police station / Police

vehicle will be alerted to provide required — assistance to app user. SMS alert will be sent to registered friends/family members about emergency. If data is low or poor, then emergency Trigger will be sent as SMS packets to control room in order to ensure emergency service by knowing last location of the caller. Even if the user does not know read and write the user can register a specific select complaint with the help of a short video/image.

Outcome of the Programme

The outcome of the Kaavalan APP awareness program conducted by second-year students from the Chemistry department in Koratti village is multifaceted. Firstly, the program significantly heightened awareness among villagers regarding the Kaavalan app, elucidating its functionalities and potential benefits for enhancing safety and security within the community. Through interactive sessions and demonstrations, villagers gained a thorough understanding of how to download, install, and utilize the app effectively in various emergency situations. Moreover, the program facilitated meaningful engagement between the students and villagers, fostering open dialogue and the exchange of ideas. This interaction not only encouraged active participation but also provided valuable insights into the community's specific needs and concerns regarding safety measures. Additionally, the program empowered villagers by equipping them with the knowledge and tools necessary to take proactive steps towards safeguarding their well-being. By embracing modern technology and the Kaavalan app, villagers felt more empowered to respond to emergencies and report incidents promptly, thereby contributing to a safer environment for all. Furthermore, the program served as a platform for collecting valuable feedback from villagers regarding their experience with the Kaavalan app and any challenges they may encounter in its usage. This feedback will be instrumental in refining strategies and addressing any barriers to ensure sustained adoption and efficacy of the app within the community. Overall, the Kaavalan APP awareness program represents a proactive initiative that not only enhances awareness but also empowers and mobilizes the community towards collective safety and well-being.

The second B.Sc. ACTIVITY – 2, UZHAVAN APP (– உழவன் APP)

As our college is located in a rural area with the maximum of the people depending on the agricultural income we decided to make the students to involve in a process that may help the people around us in their occupation. As the agricultural industry also is slowly changing from conventional and seasonal farming method to technology based one we decided to educate the people on the facilities related to information technology. The uzhavan app is such a one the has been designed by the government for educating the people involving in the agricultural processes. This app has been designed with all essential components that may be beneficial in all aspects of farming from cultivation to marketing. A group of our students went to the four remote villages namely, Koratti, Thattati, Kundrakudi and Thulavoor and explained the following that include real-time information offered by the uzhavan app for the betterment of the uzhavar community. The services provided by the app are,

- Information regarding the subsidies available in the agricultural and its related other departments.
- 2) Registration to avail subsidy on priority basis. Farmers can register in advance to avail the high value input subsidy on priority basis.
- 3) Crop insurance services including crop wise premium and the locations to which the insurance is applicable in the particular period of time.
- 4) Fertilizer stock availability in both the government and private shops on real time basis.
- 5) Seeds stock availability in both the government and private shops on real time basis.
- 6) Information on the availability of farming machineries for hiring by the registered farmers.
- 7) Market rates for farm products on real time basis.
- 8) Weather forecast for four days in advance.
- 9) Contact details and area wise visiting details of agricultural and horticultural officers on real time basis.
- 10) Water levels in major water reservoirs in Tamil Nadu and nearby states from catchment areas of the respective reservoir.
- 11) Agriculture information from the respective department on real time basis.
- 12) Feedbacks from stack holders.
- 13) Detailed crop wise technical information from sowing to harvesing.
- 14) Details of information on those who are adopting organic crop cultivation, traders and certifying agencies.
- 15) Information on farm producer organizations.
- Pest and diseases identification and control including innovative and artificial intelligence technologies.

- 17) Advanced information and registration for training for farmers and demonstrations.
- 18) Details of registered online buyer and seller information for the mutual benefit of both buyers and sellers.
